Program:

Beginning with an overnight retreat, the program is typically comprised of one-day sessions on a range of topics presented by experts in the field. These sessions begin in January.

Participants:

Each Leadership class consists of men and women who represent a cross section of the community including business, government, and educational fields. Those who are not selected are encouraged to reapply in subsequent years.

Tuition:

To cover the expenses of the program, tuition is \$650 per person, which included the overnight retreat plus all meals and materials. Tuition may be paid by the individual or his or her employer and is payable at the time of acceptance into the program.
